Her current research interests focus on the course of mourning after traumatic loss; construction of a self-help program for coping with the sudden death of a loved one; development of an integrated group intervention for traumatic loss survivors; and evaluation of an intervention program for traumatized first responders after critical incidents. She is the author of Treatment of Complicated Mourning; How To Go On Living When Someone You Love Dies; and Grief, Dying, and Death: Clinical Interventions for Caregivers; and is a co-author of Treating Traumatic Bereavement: A Practitioner's Guide.
